Certified Medication Aide (CMA)

[HEALTHCARE]



Caring for others and their well-being is central to what a certified medication aide is all about! A CMA typically works in a long-term care facility, administering medication and treatments to patients in a safe and prescribed manner. CMA is often a prerequisite for advanced training, allowing you to climb the healthcare ladder.

LEARNING AT WASHBURN TECH

The certified medication aide (CMA) course introduces the basic concepts of medication administration including drug classifications, drug action and nursing implications for specific drugs. You will gain hands-on experience by working in a clinical setting. High school seniors, who are at least 18 years old, as well as adult students are eligible to enroll in this five-credit-hour course. Upon completion, you will be prepared to take the Medication Aide Certification exam from the Kansas Department of Aging and Disability Services. However, you must be 18 years of age to take the certification exam, as stipulated by state law, and must take the exam within a year of starting CMA coursework. Please note: this short-term course is not eligible for financial aid or commencement.

JOB AND SALARY OUTLOOK

Kansas Department of Labor expects demand for medical assistants to grow by 29 percent between 2016 and 2026. According to KDOL, the average entry-level salary in 2018 was \$11.98 an hour or \$24,920 annually. The average was \$14.68 an hour or \$30,540 annually.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You must have a current Kansas CNA license to enroll. Students are required to take the Accuplacer test and score a 4 in both reading and math. Other assessments or college coursework can be accepted in place of Accuplacer. See a recruiter for details. Students must complete an application, submit a copy of transcripts and your social security number.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

CMA

The Certified Medication Aide (CMA) course is designed for the person seeking work in a long-term care facility.

The CMA course introduces the student to basic concepts of medication administration including drug classification, drug action and nursing implications for specific drugs. Students participate in hands-on experiences in a clinic setting.

Upon completion of the course, students are eligible to receive a Medication Aide certificate after passing the Kansas Department of Aging and Disability Services exam. Prerequisite: CNA Certification
