If you are focused, assertive, organized and a quick thinker, this career might be for you.

LEARNING AT WASHBURN TECH

Our surgical technology program is designed to prepare full-day, adult students with the basic skills necessary to become an integral member of the surgical team. You will learn how to prepare the operating room including instruments and surgical supplies, instrumentation during surgical procedures and application of aseptic technique and sterilization procedures. This is an associate degree program that requires general education requirements in addition to coursework at Washburn Tech. Students also benefit from hands-on training they receive in clinicals. Upon completion, you will earn an associate of applied science degree. You also will be prepared to take the National Board of Surgical Technology exam and enter your career field!

JOB AND SALARY OUTLOOK

Employment in this field is expected to grow as the population ages. The Kansas Department of Labor reports the average salary for a surgical technologist is \$19.14 an hour or \$39,809 annually. The highest wage was \$27.53 an hour or \$57,260 annually.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

INTRO TO SURGICAL TECHNOLOGY

Introduces the student to professional responsibilities, duties and general functions of the operating room

HUMAN ANATOMY & PHYSIOLOGY + LAB

Covers the structure and function of the skeletal. muscular, nervous, sensory, circulatory, respiratory, digestive and urinary systems

CPR

Learn the lifesaving skills necessary in an emergency

MICROBIOLOGY & LAB

Covers basic microorganisms and how they relate to the operating room and sterile technique

MEDICAL TERMINOLOGY Covers the language of the medical field

PRINCIPLES & PRACTICES OF SURG TECH Covers basic practices of the operating room

PRINCIPLES & PRACTICES OF SURG TECH LAB

Allows the student to apply the knowledge that he/she learned in Principles and Practices of ST

SURGICAL PROCEDURES I

Covers the basic general, gynecological and genitourinary surgical procedures; students also learn the instrumentation needed, pathology, sutures used and special considerations

SURGICAL PHARMACOLOGY

Course begins with weights and measurements using the metric system and its application

SURGICAL PROCEDURES II & III

Students learn ENT, maxillofacial, orthopedic, vascular, plastic surgery and neuro surgical procedures

SURGICAL TECH CLINICAL I & II

Students apply knowledge in the operating room

SURGICAL TECH CERTIFICATION REVIEW

Review in preparation for national certification exam

The Washburn Tech Surgical Technology program is in alignment with the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) CIP Code 51.0909: Surgical Technology/Technologist. A program that prepares individuals, under the supervision of physicians and surgical nurses, to maintain, monitor, and enforce the sterile field and adherence to aseptic technique by preoperative, surgical team, and postoperative personnel. Includes instruction in instrument and equipment sterilization and handling, surgical supplies management, wound exposure and closure, surgical computer and robot operation and monitoring, maintenance of hemostasis, and patient and team scrubbing.
