



Auto Collision

The Auto Collision program offers a hands-on, 50 credit technical certificate that prepares individuals to apply technical knowledge and skills to repair and refinish all types of vehicles. Each damaged vehicle presents a different challenge. The mission of Washburn Tech's Auto Collision program is to conduct an academic, hands-on training program that includes Inter-Industry Conference on Auto Collision Repair (I-CAR) Enhanced Delivery Curriculum. National Automobile Technician Education Foundation (NATEF) standards are utilized to meet industry requirements which will provide highly qualified employees for entry-level positions in auto collision repair.

Students have the opportunity to develop a close working relationship with the collision repair industry through the advisory council and keep abreast of the needs of future employers.

Full time students can complete the program in one year. Part time, including high school students, can complete the program in four semesters. Students who successfully complete the program may be eligible to complete their associate's degree at Washburn University.



The program consists of the following courses:

- Structural Analysis and Damage Repair
- Estimate/Damage
- Paint/Refinishing
- Mechanical/Electrical
- Workplace Skills
- Collision Repair OJT
