Who can enroll in the Adult Education/GED program at Washburn Tech?

Learners meeting the four (4) criteria below are eligible for WIOA Title II services.

1. Has reached 16 years of age
2. Is not enrolled or required to be enrolled in secondary school under state law
3. Is basic skills deficient, does not have a secondary school diploma or its recognized equivalent, or is an English language learner
4. Is a U.S. citizen, a U.S. non-citizen national, or a qualified alien

Currently, no documentation is required. We are awaiting further guidance regarding the collection of any required documentation and will notify you promptly if this changes.

How much are GED classes?

- There is a \$30 materials fee that is paid when you attend orientation.
- There are 4 GED tests (Math, Social Studies, Science, and Reading). Each tests costs \$39 and is paid online when you schedule a test.

How long does it take someone to complete their GED?

- Every student is different. Some students can finish in a month, and some may take a year. It all depends on the skill level and effort put forth by the student.

I want to enroll in the Accelerated Opportunity Program (AO-K), how do I do that?

- The first step is to get enrolled in the GED program.
- You must be in good standing in the GED program and have acceptable test scores to be eligible for the AO-K program.
- Once you are eligible our staff will assist you with getting enrolled in the pathway that you choose.

Ok, this sounds great, what do I do next?

- If you are 16 or 17 years old, you will need to provide an Attendance Exemption Disclaimer from the last high school you attended to be eligible for the GED classes.
- Once we receive your completed application, we will contact you to get you registered for the next orientation. We offer orientations periodically throughout the year.
- Orientation is 3 days long during the class time that you plan to attend and on the campus you will be attending. It is **mandatory** that you attend all 3 days.
- Once orientation is complete you will start classes the following week.
