Incomplete applications will not be considered. Read carefully and submit the specific information requested. You may choose to fill out the fillable PDF version of the spring scholarship application. However, this form must be printed and submitted to the Financial Aid Office.

All scholarships are competitive. Applications will be read and rated by teams of Tech staff. Each will assign ratings; students receiving the higher overall ratings will be awarded scholarships. Students awarded scholarships need to write "thank you" notes to the donor.

Who qualifies to apply: Post-secondary students enrolled in one of the following career programs: Advanced Systems Tech, Auto Collision, Auto Service Tech, Carpentry, Climate & Energy, Commercial & Heavy Construction, Cosmetology, Culinary Arts, Diesel Tech, Early Childhood Professional, Electrical Tech, Engineering/Drafting/Design, EMT, Graphics, Heavy Diesel Tech, Industrial Production Tech, Information Systems Tech, Phlebotomy, Plumbing, Practical Nursing (not pre-requisites), Machine Tool Tech (Cert A & Cert C), Surgical Tech, Welding (Cert A & Cert C)

<u>Additional criteria:</u> Need earned high school diploma or GED; **must live in Shawnee County**; may be new to the program or continuing in same program. If continuing, must have a 3.0 or better cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) at end of fall semester 2022.

<u>Award amount:</u> \$600 for students enrolled in 18 credits hours or more per semester; \$300 for students enrolled 9-17 credit hours per semester

Renewal for fall semester 2023: Continuing students must reapply for the 2023-2024 academic year

<u>Additional criteria:</u> Need earned high school diploma or GED; must have one completed semester in current program with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better

<u>Award amount:</u> \$1,000 <u>No renewals for subsequent semesters.</u>

Name of Scholarship: Daniel Kelley Memorial Scholarship (will award one scholarship)

Who qualifies to apply: Post-secondary students enrolled in Diesel Tech or Heavy Diesel Tech

<u>Additional criteria:</u> Need earned high school diploma or GED; must have one completed semester in program with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher

<u>Award amount:</u> \$500 <u>No renewals for subsequent semesters.</u>

Scholarship Recommendation Form: 1 of 2 must be from a diesel program instructor

Name of Scholarship: William T. Goff Scholarship (may award multiple scholarships)

Must be enrolled in the first semester (1st or 2nd semester for evening)

Must identify as non-white

Must be eligible for Pell grant

Must be a Kansas resident

Transcript must reflect Satisfactory Academic Progress in all prerequisite

courses ("C" or higher in all courses)

Additional criteria: Submit the Guardian Angel application (separate application), submit two recommendation forms

Award amount: \$1000

Renewable for following semester if a 2.5 or better GPA is achieved at the end of spring semester

Name of Scholarship: Eldon Gideon Scholarship (May award one or more scholarships spring semester)

Who qualifies to apply: Must be **Seaman High School graduate** enrolled in one of the following programs: Advanced Systems Tech, Auto Collision, Auto Service Tech, Cabinet and Millwork, Carpentry, Climate & Energy, Commercial & Heavy Construction, Diesel Tech, Electrical Tech, Engineering/Drafting/Design, Heavy Diesel Construction, Industrial Production Tech, Information Systems Tech, or Machine/Tool (48 credit program)

Additional criteria: Student cannot have a record of participation in any extracurricular competitive sport while in high school; Tech scholarship coordinator will verify with Seaman High school administration

Award amount: \$500

Name of Scholarship: Foundations of Health Care Pathways (will award multiple scholarships)

Who qualifies to apply: High school students living in Shawnee County; all students meeting the

residency requirement may be awarded funds provided through JEDO/GO Topeka, part of the

Shawnee County Chamber of Commerce (Applications will be taken to the classroom).

Award amount: \$200

Name of Scholarship: Certified Medication Aide Scholarship (may award one or more

scholarships)

Who qualifies to apply: Post-secondary or high school students

Award amount: up to \$500; the award will vary from student to student. If student is fully

sponsored (having all charges paid through A-OK, or an agency such as Rehabilitation Services),

the student is NOT eligible for this scholarship. High school students may be awarded funds to

cover only charges not reimbursed to Tech by Kansas Board of Regents CTE funding, up to \$500

Name of Scholarship: Certified Nurse Aide Scholarship (may award one or more scholarships)

Note: Only the 6-credit hour C N A program is eligible for Promise

Award amount: \$500

Scholarship Recommendation Form: Must be from 2 individuals employed in the

nursing/health care field or other helping profession

Name of Scholarship: Industrial Production Tech Scholarship (may award multiple scholarships)

Who qualifies to apply: High school students enrolled in Industrial Production Tech

Post-secondary students may apply for the JEDO and/or Kansas Promise Scholarship

Award amount: \$800 initial award in fall 2022

Renewal for spring semester: Yes, additional award of \$800 if student achieves a 2.5 or better GPA at the end of fall semester and continues in program

<u>Scholarship Recommendation Form:</u> One must be from high school teacher, counselor, coach or other school personnel who knows your work habits. One may be from a current or former worksite supervisor.

Name of Scholarship: Blanche Bryden Foundation Scholarship (may award multiple scholarships)

If approved for Fall 2022 and continuing to Spring 2023, will qualify for additional Bryden scholarship if cumulative GPA is 2.5 or higher

Who qualifies to apply: High school students enrolled in any program who provide documentation of low income/family financial need. Example: verification of eligibility for free/reduced textbooks & fees at high school

Award amount: up to \$150 per semester

Renewal: Must reapply for Bryden award for the 2023-2024 academic year if continuing enrollment at Tech
