Overview of Program

Court Reporters use their voice to capture, document, and preserve each word spoken in a multitude of settings. They utilize cutting-edge technology to produce speech-to-text output. Reporters provide services in a variety of legal settings, such as courtrooms, depositions, and agency hearings. They caption open-and-closed news, sports, and television shows for broadcasting companies, and provide real-time services (CART) for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Community in the classroom, courtroom and other areas. Students can expect a starting salary of \$42,586 as a transcriptionist.

Upon successful completion of this one-year program, students will have the skills required to sit for the Kansas Certified Court Reporter (CCR) exam. The examination is administered by the Kansas Board of Examiners of Court Reporters. Once a certified court reporter, you can expect to receive an annual salary of \$58,405 per year. After one year of service, your annual salary is \$64,476 a year, with a salary of up to \$74,629 per year.

Demand for court reporters is expected to grow 3% in the 10 years across the United States, with more than 2,100 new job openings each year.
