** It is possible that a student could fulfill their certificate requirements of 51 credit hours before reaching the Kansas Board of Cosmetology's requirement of 1500 contact hours to be eligible for the KBOC licensing exam. Upon successful completion of the program's 51 credit hours, students will be able to participate in the graduation ceremony and will be awarded a Washburn Tech Cosmetology certificate, but will be required to complete their remaining contact hours before becoming eligible to sit for the KBOC licensing exam. Any make-up/clinical time needed to reach KBOC's 1500 contact hour requirement, because of absences during the program, will be completed after program requirements are met. Students are charged for clinical time as per the chart on the Cosmetology cost sheet. These clinical hour(s) charges are not financial aid eligible.*

KBOC regulations require students to have a social security number to be eligible to register for an apprentice license in the state of Kansas. Therefore, students enrolling at Washburn Tech in the Cosmetology course(s) must provide their social security number during the application process. An Individual Taxpayer Identification Numbers (ITIN) cannot be accepted in lieu of a social security number, and those persons in the United States on a visa, must provide the visa type, as not all visas are eligible.

- ❖ Students will work with their instructor on a **lab hours** schedule and it will be based on the following:

100 contact hours = 3 credit hours	300 contact hours = 9 credit hours
200 contact hours = 6 credit hours	400 contact hours = 12 credit hours
- ❖ Students who need to complete make-up or "clinical" hours, due to absences, will be notified by their instructor. Clinical hours are based on the following:

0-22 contact hours needed = No additional charges
23-45 contact hours needed = 1 credit hour charges assessed
46-68 contact hours needed = 2 credit hour charges assessed
69-91 contact hours needed = 3 credit hour charges assessed

HOW TO ENROLL

✓ Checklist (high school)

Seats are limited

- Complete online application
- Submit official transcripts
- Take/pass an entrance exam*
- Submit Recommendation Form by School Official
- Register for classes by meeting with your Admissions Counselor
- Attend Orientation Session (July for August start, Dec for January starts)

*You may submit an official transcript indicating an associate or bachelor's degree.

Important Notes:

- High school students are allowed to attend Washburn Tech their junior and/or senior year of high school (must be 16 years of age or older). They must meet the entrance requirements to be eligible for enrollment.
- The State of Kansas – through an initiative known as Excel in CTE – is covering the cost of tuition and related fees for all technical courses in an approved technical program. The determination of whether a course is tiered or non-tiered is determined by the State of Kansas. High School students are responsible for the standard tuition rate and associated fees for all non-tiered courses.
- High School students are responsible for program specific non-consumable fees (i.e. uniforms, online textbooks or access codes, certification testing, printed textbooks/manuals, kits, knife sets, and/or personal protective equipment).
- High School students are not eligible for federal financial aid; federal guidelines require a high school diploma or GED to be eligible to apply for federal financial aid.
- Washburn Tech reserves the right to make adjustments to a student's account as needed (and/or without prior notice) to ensure accurate schedules and/or billing.
- Students may need to purchase supplies such as (but not limited to) pens/pencils, notebooks/paper, three-ring-binders, etc. These items are purchased by the student at the vendor of their choice.
