EAST HEALTHCARE

Home health aides make a remarkable difference in the lives of the sick, disabled or elderly. They assist other health care professionals in maintaining and restoring a client to optimum levels of physical and emotional well-being while allowing that person to stay at home! This quick course moves you from a hospital setting into a residential setting.

LEARNING AT WASHBURN TECH

You must be a CNA to enroll in this part-time course, which offers two hours of credit. The program provides the foundation for more advanced healthcare programs at Washburn Tech such as practical nursing and surgical technology.

Upon completion, you will be eligible to earn a home health aide certificate after passing the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services exam. Please note: this short-term course is not eligible for financial aid or commencement.

JOB AND SALARY OUTLOOK

Employment for home health aides is expected to be excellent because of rapid growth in home health care and high replacement needs. According to the Kansas Department of Labor, the average entry-level salary for a home

health aide in 2018 was \$9.78 an hour or \$20,330 annually. The average wage was \$11.48 an hour or \$23,890 annually.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You are required to meet the minimum score on an assessment test. Washburn Tech offers the Accuplacer. A score of 4 in both reading and math is required. Other assessments or college coursework can be accepted in place of Accuplacer. Please see a recruiter for details. You also must complete an application and pay a course fee as well as submit a copy of transcripts and your social security number.

HOME HEALTH AIDE

Upon completion of the course, students are eligible to receive a certificate after passing the Kansas Department of Aging and Disability Services exam. This is a part-time course. Prerequisite: CNA certified.
