LEARNING AT WASHBURN TECH

Our early childhood education program provides training in the processes and principles of child growth and development. Instruction emphasizes social, emotional, physical and cognitive development in addition to support services for children. You will gain hands-on experience by working in the licensed child care center on our campus, Little Learners at Washburn Tech, or another center in your community. Students may earn either a Cert A of 24-credit-hours or a Cert C of 48 credits. Upon completion of a Cert C, you will be eligible to complete a more advanced degree at Washburn University.

JOB AND SALARY OUTLOOK

Employment of early childhood professionals is projected to grow 18 percent from 2020 to 2030, according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. Kansas Department of Labor child care worker in Kansas is \$13.38 an hour or \$27,824 annually. The average is \$16 an hour or \$33,280 annually.
